

Rules and Regulations
for Conference Participants
“Hotel Investors Meeting” September 21, 2026

§ 1. General Provisions

1. These Terms and Conditions apply to participants of the “Hotel Investors Meeting” Conference on September 21, 2026, hereinafter referred to as the Conference, co-organized by: Nowy Adres sp. z o. o. with its registered office in Warsaw (00-833), ul. Sienna 75, entered in the Register of Entrepreneurs of the National Court Register under KRS number 0000977994, whose registration files are kept by the District Court for the Capital City of Warsaw in Warsaw, 12th Commercial Division of the National Court Register, with Tax Identification Number (NIP): 5272385577, REGON: 015242444, hereinafter referred to as the Organizer.
2. The Conference will take place on September 21, 2026, in Warsaw at the Hotel Warszawa. The official website of the Conference is available at: <https://www.hotelinvestorsmeeting.pl>.
3. The Organizer reserves the right to cancel, shorten, or reschedule the Conference or change its venue, as well as to make changes to the Conference program, and undertakes to announce such changes on the Website; furthermore, if changes regarding the cancellation, rescheduling, or venue of the Conference occur after a registration has been submitted – it will also notify participants electronically by sending an email to the address provided in the registration, with sufficient advance notice.
4. The terms used in these Terms and Conditions have the following meanings:
 - a) Conference – The “Hotel Investors Meeting 2026” Conference, an event organized by the Organizer aimed at enhancing participants’ knowledge and facilitating the exchange of experiences, to be held on September 21, 2026, in Warsaw at the Hotel Warszawa;
 - b) Consumer – A Participant who is a natural person and who has registered for the Conference for a purpose not directly related to their business or professional activity, to whom the provisions of the Act of May 30, 2014, on Consumer Rights (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2020, item 287) apply;
 - c) Materials – textual or graphic materials related to the Conference provided to the Participant, including industry reports;
 - d) Event Venue – Warsaw, the premises of Hotel Warszawa, 9 Powstańców Warszawy Square;
 - e) Sole Proprietor – A participant who is a natural person and who has registered for the Conference for a purpose directly related to their business activity, provided that the registration indicates that such activity is not of a professional nature for that person, arising

in particular from the nature of the business activity they conduct, to which the provisions of the Act of May 30, 2014, on Consumer Rights (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2020, item 287) apply;

- f) Website – the official website of the Conference located at: <https://hotelinvestorsmeeting.pl>, which contains all information regarding the Conference.
- g) Participant – a legal entity or natural person conducting business activity who has registered to participate for a purpose directly related to their business activity and has paid the applicable fee for participation in the Conference or has been invited by the Organizer;
- h) Service – a service provided by the Organizer under the terms set forth in the Terms and Conditions, i.e., the service of selling the Participant the right to participate in the Conference and, where applicable, the service of providing access to the Materials;
- i) Physical defect – a defect consisting in the non-conformity of the sold item with the contract; in particular, the sold item is non-conforming with the contract if it lacks the characteristics that an item of this type should possess in view of the purpose specified in the contract or arising from the circumstances or intended use, it lacks the characteristics the seller assured the buyer existed; it is unsuitable for the purpose the buyer informed the seller of at the time of concluding the contract, and the seller did not raise any objections regarding such use; or it was delivered to the buyer in an incomplete condition;
- j) Legal defect – a defect consisting in the fact that the item sold is owned by a third party or is encumbered by a third party's right, and there is also a restriction on the use or disposal of the item resulting from a decision or ruling of a competent authority;
- k) Order – a legal relationship established between the Organizer and the Participant as described in § 2 of the Terms and Conditions; the subject of the Order is the sale of the right to participate in the Conference.

§ 2. Participation in the Conference

1. Only a person who has registered for participation and paid the applicable fee in accordance with the Terms and Conditions may be a Conference Participant.
2. The conditions for participation in the Conference are:
 - a) submitting a registration to the Organizer's sales representative
and
 - b) payment of the applicable fee.
3. The Organizer reserves the right to close registration early if the Conference reaches capacity.

4. Proper registration with the Organizer's sales representative requires acceptance of these Terms and Conditions and the provision of the following information about the registrant:
 - a) first and last name,
 - b) email address,
 - c) phone number,
 - d) if self-employed: company name and address – street, building number, city, country, tax identification number (NIP).
5. Payment must be made via bank transfer upon submission of the registration.
6. The contract for the sale of the right to participate in the Conference (Order) is concluded upon payment by the Participant and receipt of a purchase confirmation from the Organizer's sales representative.
7. Failure to pay the full fee for participation in the Conference results in the Organizer's rejection of the registration. In case of doubt, particularly if the Conference has reached capacity, the order of registration is determined by the time the registration is submitted.
8. The fees for participation in the Conference are specified on the Website and in the Organizer's commercial offer.
9. Journalists are entitled to free admission to the Conference only after they have been granted accreditation. Accreditation is granted first to media outlets collaborating with the Organizer. Other media representatives may apply for accreditation by contacting the Organizer.
10. Conference Participants are responsible for covering their own travel, transportation, and accommodation expenses.
11. By accepting the Terms and Conditions and participating in the Conference, the Participant grants the Organizer and entities cooperating with the Organizer in the organization of the Conference permission to use, record, process, reproduce, and distribute their image as well as the image of minors under the Participant's care, captured in the form of photographs or video recordings, and grants the Organizer a non-exclusive, unlimited in terms of territory and time, free license to use his/her image as well as the image of minors under the Participant's care, captured in connection with participation in the Conference, for informational, promotional, and advertising purposes related to the Conference or the Organizer's activities in the following fields of exploitation:
 - a) recording and reproduction by any known technique, and distribution in any form,
 - b) storing in computer memory and on a multimedia network,
 - c) reproduction of the recorded image,

- d) public display, screening, playback, and broadcasting and rebroadcasting, as well as making it publicly available in such a way that anyone may access it at a place and time of their choosing, in particular on social media platforms administered by the Organizer, e.g., Facebook, Instagram, LinkedIn, etc.,
 - e) posting and publishing in the press, on websites, posters and billboards, and social media platforms,
 - f) broadcasting on television and radio.
12. By registering for the Conference and accepting the Terms and Conditions, the Participant consents to the recording.
 13. When registering for the event, Participants may provide separate consent for the processing of their personal data for purposes other than those mentioned above (e.g., marketing purposes related to the Organizer's organization of other events).
 14. The Organizer shall not be liable for any damages incurred by Participants as a result of failure to comply with instructions issued by the Organizer's staff in situations posing a threat to the safety of persons and property, e.g., in connection with an order to evacuate persons from the Event Venue.
 15. The Organizer's exclusion of liability for the above reasons is not affected by security measures taken at the Event Venue (technical security, security personnel, surveillance).

§ 3. Liability and Complaints

1. The Organizer is obligated to provide Services free from physical and legal defects.
2. The Organizer does not provide any warranty for the Services.
3. Neither the Organizer nor the Participant shall be liable to each other for the non-performance or improper performance of any obligations arising from the Terms and Conditions to the extent that such failure is caused by force majeure.
4. The Organizer shall not be liable for damages to another Participant, third parties, or property caused by any Participant.
5. In connection with the provision of the Services, the Organizer shall be liable in accordance with the general principles set forth in the Civil Code.
6. None of the provisions of these Terms and Conditions shall limit the rights of the Consumer and the Sole Proprietor to which they are entitled under applicable law.
7. The Consumer and Sole Proprietor have the right to file a complaint regarding the organization and conduct of the Conference.
8. The Organizer is responsible for handling complaints.

9. The complaint should include information enabling the identification of the person filing it, the subject of the complaint, and the requests related to the complaint. In the body of the complaint, the Consumer and Sole Proprietor should include:
 - a) their identifying information, i.e., first and last name and company name,
 - b) contact information: email address and phone number,
 - c) a description of the reason for the complaint.
9. If an incomplete complaint is received, the Organizer will request that the Consumer or Sole Proprietor supplement it, failing which the complaint will not be considered.
10. The Organizer will process the complaint immediately, but no later than within 14 days from the date of receipt of the complete complaint sent by mail to the Organizer's registered office or by email tokontakt@nowyadres.pl. The expiration of the aforementioned deadline does not result in the expiration of claims and does not affect the right of the Consumer and Sole Proprietor to pursue any claims through judicial or extrajudicial proceedings.
11. Information regarding the resolution of the complaint will be provided to the Consumer and Sole Proprietor at the email address they provided or by another method specified by the Consumer or Sole Proprietor.
12. Acceptance of a complaint by a Consumer or Sole Proprietor entails a refund of all or part of the fee paid.
13. If the Organizer does not accept a complaint filed by a Consumer or a Sole Proprietor, the Consumer or Sole Proprietor may pursue judicial and extrajudicial remedies, in accordance with the information contained in § 8 of the Terms and Conditions.

§ 4. Withdrawal from participation, refunds, and termination of the contract

1. If a Participant is unable to attend for reasons attributable to the Participant, the registration cannot be transferred to another event organized by the Organizer, and the Organizer will not refund the registration fee.
2. In the event of the cancellation of the Conference, the Organizer shall notify the Participant of this fact, and the Participant shall be entitled to:
 - a) a refund of the fee paid in accordance with the terms set forth in paragraph 4 below, or
 - b) to participate in another Conference scheduled by the Organizer or an event organized by the Organizer within the scope of the fee paid, in an amount corresponding to the value of the originally paid participation fee.

3. In the event of a change in the date or venue of the Conference, the Organizer shall notify the Participant of this fact, and the Participant shall be entitled to:
 - a) a refund of the fee paid, in accordance with the terms set forth in paragraph 4 below, or
 - b) participation in the Conference on the date and at the location proposed by the Organizer, within the scope of the fee paid, in an amount corresponding to the value of the originally paid participation fee.
4. To exercise the right to a refund of the paid fee in connection with the cancellation of the Conference or a change in its date or location, the Participant shall notify the Organizer of this via mail or email within 7 days of receiving notification from the Organizer. Within 14 days of receiving the information from the Participant referred to in the preceding sentence, the Organizer shall refund the paid fee to the bank account from which the payment for the Service was made, unless the Participant explicitly specifies a different account number to which the refund should be made.
5. In particularly justified cases, due to circumstances beyond the Organizer's control—such as the cancellation of a presentation by a speaker or lecturer (i.e., a person scheduled to lead the Conference)—the Organizer may cancel the Conference, reschedule it, or modify the program.
6. A change to the Conference program does not constitute grounds for withdrawing from participation or requesting a refund of the fee paid.
7. Pursuant to Article 38(12) of the Act of May 30, 2014, on Consumer Rights (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2020, item 287, as amended) A Participant (Consumer or Sole Proprietor) entering into a contract (Order) via the Website, i.e., outside the business premises or at a distance, is not entitled to withdraw from the contract (Order) without giving a reason, as referred to in Article 27 of the aforementioned Act. The above exclusion applies to events of an entertainment, sports, or cultural nature if the contract (Order) specifies the date of the event, which the Organizer does in the Terms and Conditions with respect to the Conference.

§ 5. Rules and Regulations

1. Participants are not permitted to record (photograph, film, or record audio) any part of the Conference program using any audiovisual means, unless the Participant has obtained the appropriate permission from the Organizer. If the above activities may disrupt the organization and conduct of the Conference, the Organizer may order them to cease.
2. During the Conference, Participants are prohibited from engaging in any commercial, solicitation, advertising, promotional, or campaign activities, as well as fundraising not agreed upon with the Organizer, and any activities inconsistent with applicable laws.
3. The following are prohibited at the event venue:
 - a) bringing in and using weapons, ammunition, pyrotechnic materials, and hazardous chemicals, as well as open flames, which pose a fire hazard, damage property, and endanger the health and lives of people;
 - b) bringing alcohol, as well as distributing and using intoxicating substances;
 - c) disturbing public order (e.g., loud, aggressive behavior);
 - d) bringing in animals, as well as bicycles, etc.
4. It is prohibited to leave any items unattended, including luggage or other personal belongings.
5. Items and substances specified in paragraph 3(a) above, as well as items left unattended on the Event Site, may, for safety reasons, be removed or destroyed by the Organizer or specialized services at the expense of the person who left the items or substances, unless it is impossible to determine to whom they belonged. If it becomes necessary to evacuate people from the Event Venue, the costs of such evacuation will be charged to the persons who left these items.
6. Participants are required to:
 - a) comply with instructions issued by staff or persons employed by the Organizer or entities cooperating with the Organizer in organizing the Conference for organizational and safety reasons (the need to secure property and ensure the safety of persons present at the Event Venue), e.g., regarding the evacuation of persons from conference rooms;
 - b) complying with instructions from Fire Department officers or other government services during evacuations, rescue operations, or inspection and reconnaissance activities.

§ 6. Processing of Personal Data

1. The controller of personal data processed in connection with the organization of the Conference is: Nowy Adres sp. z o. o. with its registered office in Warsaw (00-833), ul. Sienna 75, entered in the Register of Entrepreneurs of the National Court Register under KRS number 0000977994, whose registration files are kept by the District Court for the Capital City of Warsaw in Warsaw, 12th Commercial Division of the National Court Register, with Tax Identification Number (NIP): 5272385577, REGON: 015242444.
2. Participants' personal data will be used in accordance with the terms set forth in Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016 on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and repealing Directive 95/46/EC (OJ L 119, May 4, 2016, pp. 1–88, hereinafter referred to as the GDPR), the Act of May 10, 2018, on the Protection of Personal Data (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2019, item 1781, as amended, hereinafter referred to as the UODO), Polish regulations adopted to enable the application of the GDPR, other applicable laws, and the Terms and Conditions.
3. The Personal Data Controller has appointed a Data Protection Officer who may be contacted regarding matters related to the processing and protection of personal data atiod@nowyadres.pl or orkontakt@nowyadres.pl , or in writing to the address of the Personal Data Controller's registered office.
4. The Personal Data Controller does not transfer data to a third country or international organization. Participants' personal data will not be subject to automated processing, including profiling.
5. Providing personal data is voluntary, but failure to do so will prevent the conclusion of the contract (Order) and participation in the Conference. Personal data provided in the registration form will be processed for the purpose and to the extent necessary for the organization of the Conference. Personal data is processed for the following purposes:
 - a) the conclusion and performance, in accordance with the terms set forth in the Conference Regulations, of a contract (Order) for the provision of services related to participation in conferences and industry meetings (acceptance of the Regulations and registration for the Congress, as well as the Organizer's acceptance of the registration and participation fee, constitute the conclusion of the agreement) – the legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR;
 - b) responding to questions posed by Participants and other persons associated with the Conference, as well as fulfilling obligations related to complaints regarding the provision of services – the basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(b) of the GDPR;

- c) arising from legal provisions—the basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(c) of the GDPR;
 - d) archiving and reporting purposes, as well as to establish, pursue, and defend against claims related to the organized Conference, and to ensure the safety of persons and property—the legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(f) of the GDPR;
 - e) promotion of the Conference – the legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(a)
 - f) GDPR;
6. A Participant may give voluntary consent, e.g., to the sending of commercial information by electronic means or direct marketing via telephone. In such a case, personal data will be processed to the extent necessary to achieve the purpose(s) for which consent was given, until the Participant withdraws their consent. The legal basis for the processing of personal data is Article 6(1)(a) of the GDPR—the voluntary, unambiguous, informed, and specific consent of the data subject.
7. Withdrawal of consent does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out on the basis of consent prior to its withdrawal.
8. Participants have the right to:
- a) access to data,
 - b) rectification of data,
 - c) data portability,
 - d) erase data or restrict its processing,
 - e) withdraw consent to data processing.
- Within the limits of the law, the Participant also has the right to object to the processing of their personal data if the Organizer processes it for a purpose based on its legitimate interest. The rights referred to above may be exercised by submitting a written request to the address of the Personal Data Controller.
9. Participants also have the right to file a complaint with the President of the Personal Data Protection Office (ul. Stawki 2, 00-193 Warsaw) regarding the processing of their data by the Personal Data Controller.
10. Personal data processed for purposes and to the extent related to the organization of the Conference shall be processed for a period no longer than is necessary to perform the services and for the period required by law regarding, among other things, the expiration of the statute of limitations for potential claims arising from the concluded contract (Order) and the fulfillment of archiving obligations. After this period, the personal data shall be deleted.

§ 7. Copyright

1. Upon delivery of the Materials to the Participant, the Organizer grants the Participant, as part of the fee paid, a non-exclusive license to use the Materials, without the right to grant sublicenses.
2. The license may be terminated with one month's notice. The minimum term of the license is one month.
3. Participants are authorized to use the Materials solely for educational purposes and only to the extent necessary to use them in accordance with their intended purpose, in the following fields of exploitation:
 - a) with respect to the fixation and reproduction of the Materials—the production of copies of the Materials using specified techniques, including printing, reprography, magnetic recording, and digital techniques;
 - b) loading the Materials into the memory of a computer or other device, and displaying them on the screen of a computer or other device.
4. Participants are not authorized to distribute the Materials or make them available in any manner beyond the scope of fair use as provided by law.
5. Participants are required to use the Materials in a manner consistent with the Terms and Conditions and without infringing upon the moral rights of their creators, particularly the right of authorship of the Materials. In particular, participants are not authorized to mark the Materials with their first name, last name, or pseudonym, or to remove the author's first name, last name, or pseudonym from them, to make any other changes to the Materials, or to incorporate the Materials into other works.
6. Participants are not authorized to use the Materials in the course of their business or professional activities, except for educational purposes.
7. Paragraphs 3–5 above do not prejudice the Participant's right to exercise the right to quote, provided that the Participant is required to use quotations from the Materials in a manner consistent with Article 29, 34, and 35 of the Act of February 4, 1994, on Copyright and Related Rights (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2021, item 1062, as amended), and in particular, each quotation must be accompanied by the author's first and last name and the source of the quotation.
8. If a Participant intends to use the Materials in a manner exceeding the rights granted under these Terms and Conditions, they are required to obtain the Organizer's prior written consent, under penalty of nullity.
9. The Participant is not authorized—without first obtaining the Organizer's written consent (in writing under penalty of nullity) or beyond the scope of fair use as provided by law—to photograph, film, or otherwise record the Conference.

§ 8. Out-of-court methods of handling complaints and pursuing claims

1. Consumers and sole proprietors have the option of using out-of-court complaint resolution and dispute resolution procedures. Among other things, consumers and sole proprietors may:
 - a) submit a request to a permanent consumer arbitration court to resolve a dispute arising from the Order;
 - b) apply to the provincial inspector of the Trade Inspection with a request to initiate mediation proceedings regarding the amicable resolution of a dispute between the Consumer or Sole Proprietor and the Organizer;
 - c) seek assistance from the county (municipal) consumer ombudsman or a social organization whose statutory tasks include consumer protection;
 - d) use out-of-court complaint handling and redress mechanisms via the ODR platform available online at <http://ec.europa.eu/consumers/odr>.
2. Detailed information on out-of-court complaint resolution and redress can be found on the website <http://www.uokik.gov.pl>.

§ 9. Provision of Services Electronically

1. The Organizer provides electronic services via the Website in the form of enabling registration for the Conference through the appropriate form.
2. The agreement for the provision of electronic services consisting of enabling registration for the Conference via the appropriate form is concluded for a fixed term and terminates upon the submission of an Order or the Participant's cessation of submitting Orders.
3. The Participant may submit complaints related to the provision of electronic services via the Website by sending a complaint by mail to the Organizer's registered office with the note "Electronic Services – COMPLAINT" or by email tokontakt@nowyadres.pl.
4. The complaint will be reviewed within 14 days of the Organizer's receipt of it. The Participant will be notified in writing of the outcome of the complaint process at the address provided to the Organizer. The Organizer's decision is final.
5. Pursuant to Article 8(3)(2)(b) of the Act of July 18, 2002, on the Provision of Electronic Services (i.e., Journal of Laws of 2020, item 344), a Participant using the Website is prohibited from posting unlawful content on this site.

§ 10. Amendments to the Terms and Conditions

1. The Organizer reserves the right to amend the provisions of these Terms and Conditions in the event of at least one of the following valid reasons:
 - a) changes to the terms of use of the Service that do not worsen the Participant's situation compared to the current one;
 - b) the need to update the Organizer's data specified in the Terms and Conditions;
 - c) changes in the manner of using the Service related to the introduction of new features or the removal of existing ones;
 - d) changes in applicable law governing the Organizer's operations or affecting the mutual rights and obligations of the Organizer and the Participant, or the issuance of a judgment or decision that may affect the Organizer's operations and, consequently, the mutual rights and obligations of the Organizer and the Participant;
 - e) changes in the way the Service operates, resulting from objective and independent technical or technological reasons.
2. The Organizer will notify Participants of any changes to the Terms and Conditions by publishing the new version of the Terms and Conditions on the Website, unless otherwise required by applicable law, a court ruling, or a decision by a regulatory authority. For Participants who provided their email address when placing an Order, notification of the change to the Terms and Conditions, along with the revised version, will be sent to the Participant's email address.
3. The amendments to the Terms and Conditions shall be binding on the Participant upon publication of the new version of the Terms and Conditions on the Website.

§ 11. Final Provisions

1. These Terms and Conditions are effective as of April 1, 2026.
2. The Terms and Conditions for Conference Participants are available on the Website and at the Organizer's headquarters.
3. Any disputes arising from or related to the Order, including its performance and interpretation, shall be resolved by the competent court of general jurisdiction for the Organizer's registered office.
4. Nothing in these Terms and Conditions shall limit the rights of Consumers and Sole Proprietors as provided by law. If any provision of this nature is found to exist, the provisions of generally applicable law shall apply, in particular the Civil Code and the Consumer Rights Act.
